CHAPTER 1

NOW in the first year of Čȳ-rūs king of Pěr-siā, that the word of the LORD by the mouth of Jěr-ē-mī-āh might be fulfilled, the LORD stirred up the spirit of Čȳ-rūs king of Pěr-siā, that he made a proclamation throughout all his kingdom, and *put it* also in writing, saying,

2 Thus saith Čȳ-rūs king of Pěr-siā, The LORD God of heaven hath given me all the kingdoms of the earth; and he hath charged me to build him an house at Jě-rû-să-lēm, which is in Jûd-āh.

3 Who is *there* among you of all his people? his God be with him, and let him go up to Jě-rû-să-lēm, which is in Jûd-āh, and build the house of the LORD God of Īś-rā-ěl, (he is the God,) which is in Jě-rû-să-lēm.

4 And whosoever remaineth in any place where he sojourneth, let the men of his place help him with silver, and with gold, and with goods, and with beasts, beside the freewill offering for the house of God that is in Jě-rû-să-lēm.

5 ¶ Then rose up the chief of the fathers of Jûd-āh and Běn-jă-mîn, and the priests, and the Lē-vîtes, with all *them* whose spirit God had raised, to go up to build the house of the LORD which is in Jě-rû-să-lēm.

6 And all they that *were* about them strengthened their hands with vessels of silver, with gold, with goods, and with beasts, and with precious things, beside all *that* was willingly offered.

7 ¶ Also Čȳ-rūs the king brought forth the vessels of the house of the LORD, which Něb-û-chăd-něz-zăr had brought forth out of Jě-rû-să-lēm, and had put them in the house of his gods;

8 Even those did Čȳ-rūs king of Pěr-siā bring forth by the hand of Mîth-rě-dăth the treasurer, and numbered them unto Shěsh-băz-zăr, the prince of Jûd-āh.

9 And this is the number of them: thirty chargers of gold, a thousand chargers of silver, nine and twenty knives,

10 Thirty basons of gold, silver basons of a second sort four hundred and ten, and other vessels a thousand.

11 All the vessels of gold and of silver *were* five thousand and four hundred. All *these* did Shěsh-băz-zăr bring up with *them* of the captivity that were brought up from Băb-ŷ-lon unto Jě-rû-să-lēm.

CHAPTER 2

NOW these *are* the children of the province that went up out of the captivity, of those which had been carried away, whom Něb-û-chăd-něz-zăr the king of Băb-ŷ-lon had carried away unto Băb-ŷ-lon, and came again unto Jě-rû-să-lēm and Jûd-āh, every one unto his city;

2 Which came with Zě-rüb-bă-běl: Jěsh-û-ă, Nē-hēm-ī-āh, Sě-rai-āh, Rē-ěl-ai-āh, Môr-dě-că-ī, Bîl-shăn, Mîs-păr, Bîg-vă-ī, Rē-hûm, Bă-ă-năh. The number of the men of the people of Īś-rā-ěl:

3 The children of Pâr-ōsh, two thousand an hundred seventy and two.

4 The children of Shěph-ă-tî-āh, three hundred seventy and two.

5 The children of Âr-āh, seven hundred seventy and five.

6 The children of Pă-hăth-mō-ăb, of the children of Jěsh-û-ă and Jō-ăb, two thousand eight hundred and twelve.

7 The children of Ê-lăm, a thousand two hundred fifty and four.

8 The children of Zăt-tû, nine hundred forty and five.

9 The children of Zăc-că-ī, seven hundred and threescore.

10 The children of Bă-nî, six hundred forty and two.

11 The children of Bē-bă-ī, six hundred twenty and three.

12 The children of Ăz-găd, a thousand two hundred twenty and two.

13 The children of Ăd-ō-nî-kăm, six hundred sixty and six.

14 The children of Bîg-vă-ī, two thousand fifty and six.

15 The children of Ă-dîn, four hundred fifty and four.

16 The children of Ă-těr of Hěz-ē-kî-āh, ninety and eight.

17 The children of Bē-ză-ī, three hundred twenty and three.

18 The children of Jôr-āh, an hundred and twelve.

19 The children of Hăsh-ûm, two hundred twenty and three.

20 The children of Gîb-băr, ninety and five.

21 The children of Běth-lě-hēm, an hundred twenty and three.

22 The men of Ně-tō-phăh, fifty and six.

23 The men of Ăn-ă-thōth, an hundred twenty and eight.

24 The children of Ăz-mă-věth, forty and two.

25 The children of Kîr-jăth-âr-îm, Chě-phî-răh, and Bēer-ōth, seven hundred and forty and three.

26 The children of Ră-măh and Gē-bă, six hundred twenty and one.

27 The men of Mîch-măs, an hundred twenty and two.

28 The men of Běth-ěl and Ă-ī, two hundred twenty and three.

29 The children of Nē-bō, fifty and two.

30 The children of Măg-bîsh, an hundred fifty and six.

31 The children of the other Ê-lăm, a thousand two hundred fifty and four.

32 The children of Hâr-îm, three hundred and twenty.

33 The children of Lőd, Hă-dîd, and Ō-nō, seven hundred twenty and five.

34 The children of Jěr-î-chō, three hundred forty and five.

35 The children of Sěn-ă-āh, three thousand and six hundred and thirty.

36 ¶ The priests: the children of Jě-dăi-āh, of the house of Jěsh-û-ă, nine hundred seventy and three.

37 The children of Īm-měr, a thousand fifty and two.

38 The children of Păsh-ûr, a thousand two hundred forty and seven.

39 The children of Hâr-îm, a thousand and seventeen.

40 ¶ The Lē-vītes: the children of Jēsh-ū-ā and Kād-mī-ēl, of the children of Hō-dā-vī-āh, seventy and four.

41 ¶ The singers: the children of Ā-sāph, an hundred twenty and eight.

42 ¶ The children of the porters: the children of Shāl-lūm, the children of Ā-tēr, the children of Tāl-mōn, the children of Āk-kūb, the children of Hā-tī-tā, the children of Shō-bā-ī, in all an hundred thirty and nine.

43 ¶ The Nēth-ī-nīmś: the children of Zī-hā, the children of Hā-sū-phā, the children of Tāb-bā-ōth,

44 The children of Kē-rōs, the children of Sī-ā-hā, the children of Pā-dōn,

45 The children of Lē-bā-nāh, the children of Hāg-ā-bāh, the children of Āk-kūb,

46 The children of Hā-gāb, the children of Shāl-māi, the children of Hā-nān,

47 The children of Gīd-dēl, the children of Gā-hār, the children of Rē-ai-āh,

48 The children of Rē-zīn, the children of Nē-kō-dā, the children of Gāz-zām,

49 The children of Ūz-zā, the children of Pā-sē-āh, the children of Bē-sai,

50 The children of Ās-nāh, the children of Mē-hū-nīm, the children of Nē-phū-sīm,

51 The children of Bāk-būk, the children of Hā-kū-phā, the children of Hār-hūr,

52 The children of Bāz-lūth, the children of Mē-hī-dā, the children of Hār-shā,

53 The children of Bār-kōs, the children of Sīs-ē-rā, the children of Thā-māh,

54 The children of Nē-zī-āh, the children of Hā-tī-phā.

55 ¶ The children of Sōl-ō-mōn's servants: the children of Sō-tā-ī, the children of Sō-phē-rēth, the children of Pē-rū-dā,

56 The children of Jā-ā-lāh, the children of Dār-kōn, the children of Gīd-dēl,

57 The children of Shēph-ā-tī-āh, the children of Hāt-tīl, the children of Pōch-ē-rēth of Zē-bā-īm, the children of Ā-mī.

58 All the Nēth-ī-nīmś, and the children of Sōl-ō-mōn's servants, were three hundred ninety and two.

59 And these were they which went up from Tēl-mē-lāh, Tēl-hār-sā, Chēr-ūb, Ād-dān, and Īm-mēr: but they could not shew their father's house, and their seed, whether they were of Īs-rā-ēl:

60 The children of Dēl-ai-āh, the children of Tō-bī-āh, the children of Nē-kō-dā, six hundred fifty and two.

61 ¶ And of the children of the priests: the children of Hā-bāi-āh, the children of Kōz, the children of Bār-zīl-lā-ī; which took a wife of the daughters of Bār-zīl-lā-ī the Gīl-ē-ād-īte, and was called after their name:

62 These sought their register among those that were reckoned by genealogy, but they were not found: therefore were they, as polluted, put from the priesthood.

63 And the Tīr-shā-thā said unto them, that they should

not eat of the most holy things, till there stood up a priest with Ū-rīm and with Thūm-mīm.

64 ¶ The whole congregation together was forty and two thousand three hundred and threescore,

65 Beside their servants and their maids, of whom there were seven thousand three hundred thirty and seven: and there were among them two hundred singing men and singing women.

66 Their horses were seven hundred thirty and six; their mules, two hundred forty and five;

67 Their camels, four hundred thirty and five; their asses, six thousand seven hundred and twenty.

68 ¶ And some of the chief of the fathers, when they came to the house of the LORD which is at Jē-rū-sā-lēm, offered freely for the house of God to set it up in his place:

69 They gave after their ability unto the treasure of the work threescore and one thousand drams of gold, and five thousand pound of silver, and one hundred priests' garments.

70 So the priests, and the Lē-vītes, and some of the people, and the singers, and the porters, and the Nēth-ī-nīmś, dwelt in their cities, and all Īs-rā-ēl in their cities.

CHAPTER 3

AND when the seventh month was come, and the children of Īs-rā-ēl were in the cities, the people gathered themselves together as one man to Jē-rū-sā-lēm. 2 Then stood up Jēsh-ū-ā the son of Jō-zā-dāk, and his brethren the priests, and Zē-rūb-bā-bēl the son of Shē-āl-tī-ēl, and his brethren, and builded the altar of the God of Īs-rā-ēl, to offer burnt offerings thereon, as it is written in the law of Mō-šēs the man of God.

3 And they set the altar upon his bases; for fear was upon them because of the people of those countries: and they offered burnt offerings thereon unto the LORD, even burnt offerings morning and evening.

4 They kept also the feast of tabernacles, as it is written, and offered the daily burnt offerings by number, according to the custom, as the duty of every day required;

5 And afterward offered the continual burnt offering, both of the new moons, and of all the set feasts of the LORD that were consecrated, and of every one that willingly offered a freewill offering unto the LORD.

6 From the first day of the seventh month began they to offer burnt offerings unto the LORD. But the foundation of the temple of the LORD was not yet laid.

7 They gave money also unto the masons, and to the carpenters; and meat, and drink, and oil, unto them of Zī-dōn, and to them of Tīre, to bring cedar trees from Lēb-ā-nōn to the sea of Jōp-pā, according to the grant that they had of Çy-rūs king of Pēr-siā.

8 ¶ Now in the second year of their coming unto the house of God at Jē-rū-sā-lēm, in the second month, began Zē-rūb-bā-bēl the son of Shē-āl-tī-ēl, and Jēsh-ū-ā the son of Jō-zā-dāk, and the remnant of their brethren the priests and the Lē-vītes, and all they that were come out of the

captivity unto Jě-rû-să-lēm; and appointed the Lē-vītes, from twenty years old and upward, to set forward the work of the house of the LORD.

9 Then stood Jěsh-ū-ă with his sons and his brethren, Kăd-mī-ěl and his sons, the sons of Jûd-ăh, together, to set forward the workmen in the house of God: the sons of Hěn-ă-dăd, with their sons and their brethren the Lē-vītes. 10 And when the builders laid the foundation of the temple of the LORD, they set the priests in their apparel with trumpets, and the Lē-vītes the sons of Ā-săph with cymbals, to praise the LORD, after the ordinance of Dă-vīd king of Īs-ră-ěl.

11 And they sang together by course in praising and giving thanks unto the LORD; because *he is good*, for his mercy endureth for ever toward Īs-ră-ěl. And all the people shouted with a great shout, when they praised the LORD, because the foundation of the house of the LORD was laid.

12 But many of the priests and Lē-vītes and chief of the fathers, *who were* ancient men, that had seen the first house, when the foundation of this house was laid before their eyes, wept with a loud voice; and many shouted aloud for joy:

13 So that the people could not discern the noise of the shout of joy from the noise of the weeping of the people: for the people shouted with a loud shout, and the noise was heard afar off.

CHAPTER 4

NOW when the adversaries of Jûd-ăh and Běn-jă-mīn heard that the children of the captivity builded the temple unto the LORD God of Īs-ră-ěl;

2 Then they came to Zě-rüb-bă-běl, and to the chief of the fathers, and said unto them, Let us build with you: for we seek your God, as ye do; and we do sacrifice unto him since the days of Ē-săr-hăd-dōn king of Ās-sūr, which brought us up hither.

3 But Zě-rüb-bă-běl, and Jěsh-ū-ă, and the rest of the chief of the fathers of Īs-ră-ěl, said unto them, Ye have nothing to do with us to build an house unto our God; but we ourselves together will build unto the LORD God of Īs-ră-ěl, as king Çy-rūs the king of Pěr-siā hath commanded us.

4 Then the people of the land weakened the hands of the people of Jûd-ăh, and troubled them in building,

5 And hired counsellors against them, to frustrate their purpose, all the days of Çy-rūs king of Pěr-siā, even until the reign of Dă-rī-ūs king of Pěr-siā.

6 And in the reign of Ā-hăš-ū-ē-rūs, in the beginning of his reign, wrote they unto him an accusation against the inhabitants of Jûd-ăh and Jě-rû-să-lēm.

7 ¶ And in the days of Ār-tă-xěrx-ēs wrote Bīsh-lām, Mīth-rě-dăth, Tăb-ēel, and the rest of their companions, unto Ār-tă-xěrx-ēs king of Pěr-siā; and the writing of the letter was written in the Sŷr-ī-ăn tongue, and interpreted in the Sŷr-ī-ăn tongue.

8 Rē-hūm the chancellor and Shīm-shai the scribe wrote a letter against Jě-rû-să-lēm to Ār-tă-xěrx-ēs the king in this

sort:

9 Then wrote Rē-hūm the chancellor, and Shīm-shai the scribe, and the rest of their companions; the Dī-nā-ites, the Ā-phăr-săth-chītes, the Tăr-pē-lītes, the Ā-phăr-sītes, the Ār-chě-vītes, the Băb-ŷ-lō-nī-ăns, the Sû-săn-chītes, the Dě-hă-vītes, and the Ē-lām-ites,

10 And the rest of the nations whom the great and noble Ās-năp-păr brought over, and set in the cities of Să-mâr-ī-ă, and the rest *that are* on this side the river, and at such a time.

11 ¶ This is the copy of the letter that they sent unto him, even unto Ār-tă-xěrx-ēs the king; Thy servants the men on this side the river, and at such a time.

12 Be it known unto the king, that the Jēwš which came up from thee to us are come unto Jě-rû-să-lēm, building the rebellious and the bad city, and have set up the walls thereof, and joined the foundations.

13 Be it known now unto the king, that, if this city be builded, and the walls set up *again*, then will they not pay toll, tribute, and custom, and so thou shalt endamage the revenue of the kings.

14 Now because we have maintenance from *the king's* palace, and it was not meet for us to see the king's dishonour, therefore have we sent and certified the king;

15 That search may be made in the book of the records of thy fathers: so shalt thou find in the book of the records, and know that this city is a rebellious city, and hurtful unto kings and provinces, and that they have moved sedition within the same of old time: for which cause was this city destroyed.

16 We certify the king that, if this city be builded *again*, and the walls thereof set up, by this means thou shalt have no portion on this side the river.

17 ¶ Then sent the king an answer unto Rē-hūm the chancellor, and to Shīm-shai the scribe, and to the rest of their companions that dwell in Să-mâr-ī-ă, and unto the rest beyond the river, Peace, and at such a time.

18 The letter which ye sent unto us hath been plainly read before me.

19 And I commanded, and search hath been made, and it is found that this city of old time hath made insurrection against kings, and *that* rebellion and sedition have been made therein.

20 There have been mighty kings also over Jě-rû-să-lēm, which have ruled over all *countries* beyond the river; and toll, tribute, and custom, was paid unto them.

21 Give ye now commandment to cause these men to cease, and that this city be not builded, until *another* commandment shall be given from me.

22 Take heed now that ye fail not to do this: why should damage grow to the hurt of the kings?

23 ¶ Now when the copy of king Ār-tă-xěrx-ēs' letter was read before Rē-hūm, and Shīm-shai the scribe, and their companions, they went up in haste to Jě-rû-să-lēm unto the Jēwš, and made them to cease by force and power.

24 Then ceased the work of the house of God which is at Jě-rû-să-lēm. So it ceased unto the second year of the reign of Dă-rî-ūs king of Pěr-siā.

CHAPTER 5

THEN the prophets, Hăg-gai the prophet, and Zěch-ă-rî-ăh the son of Īd-dō, prophesied unto the Jēws that were in Jûd-ăh and Jě-rû-să-lēm in the name of the God of Īs-rā-ěl, *even* unto them.

2 Then rose up Zě-rûb-bă-běl the son of Shē-ăl-tī-ěl, and Jěsh-û-ă the son of Jō-ză-dăk, and began to build the house of God which is at Jě-rû-să-lēm: and with them were the prophets of God helping them.

3 ¶ At the same time came to them Tăt-nai, governor on this side the river, and Shē-thăr-bōz-nai, and their companions, and said thus unto them, Who hath commanded you to build this house, and to make up this wall?

4 Then said we unto them after this manner, What are the names of the men that make this building?

5 But the eye of their God was upon the elders of the Jēws, that they could not cause them to cease, till the matter came to Dă-rî-ūs: and then they returned answer by letter concerning this matter.

6 ¶ The copy of the letter that Tăt-nai, governor on this side the river, and Shē-thăr-bōz-nai, and his companions the Ā-phăr-să-chītes, which were on this side the river, sent unto Dă-rî-ūs the king:

7 They sent a letter unto him, wherein was written thus; Unto Dă-rî-ūs the king, all peace.

8 Be it known unto the king, that we went into the province of Jû-dē-ă, to the house of the great God, which is builded with great stones, and timber is laid in the walls, and this work goeth fast on, and prospereth in their hands.

9 Then asked we those elders, and said unto them thus, Who commanded you to build this house, and to make up these walls?

10 We asked their names also, to certify thee, that we might write the names of the men that were the chief of them.

11 And thus they returned us answer, saying, We are the servants of the God of heaven and earth, and build the house that was builded these many years ago, which a great king of Īs-rā-ěl builded and set up.

12 But after that our fathers had provoked the God of heaven unto wrath, he gave them into the hand of Nēb-û-chăd-něz-zăr the king of Băb-ÿ-lon, the Chăl-dē-ăn, who destroyed this house, and carried the people away into Băb-ÿ-lon.

13 But in the first year of Ćÿ-rūs the king of Băb-ÿ-lon the same king Ćÿ-rūs made a decree to build this house of God.

14 And the vessels also of gold and silver of the house of God, which Nēb-û-chăd-něz-zăr took out of the temple that was in Jě-rû-să-lēm, and brought them into the temple of Băb-ÿ-lon, those did Ćÿ-rūs the king take out of the temple of Băb-ÿ-lon, and they were delivered unto one, whose name was Shěsh-băz-zăr, whom he had made governor;

15 And said unto him, Take these vessels, go, carry them into the temple that is in Jě-rû-să-lēm, and let the house of God be builded in his place.

16 Then came the same Shěsh-băz-zăr, and laid the foundation of the house of God which is in Jě-rû-să-lēm: and since that time even until now hath it been in building, and yet it is not finished.

17 Now therefore, if it seem good to the king, let there be search made in the king's treasure house, which is there at Băb-ÿ-lon, whether it be so, that a decree was made of Ćÿ-rūs the king to build this house of God at Jě-rû-să-lēm, and let the king send his pleasure to us concerning this matter.

CHAPTER 6

THEN Dă-rî-ūs the king made a decree, and search was made in the house of the rolls, where the treasures were laid up in Băb-ÿ-lon.

2 And there was found at Āch-mē-thă, in the palace that is in the province of the Mēdēs, a roll, and therein was a record thus written:

3 In the first year of Ćÿ-rūs the king the same Ćÿ-rūs the king made a decree concerning the house of God at Jě-rû-să-lēm, Let the house be builded, the place where they offered sacrifices, and let the foundations thereof be strongly laid; the height thereof threescore cubits, and the breadth thereof threescore cubits;

4 With three rows of great stones, and a row of new timber: and let the expences be given out of the king's house:

5 And also let the golden and silver vessels of the house of God, which Nēb-û-chăd-něz-zăr took forth out of the temple which is at Jě-rû-să-lēm, and brought unto Băb-ÿ-lon, be restored, and brought again unto the temple which is at Jě-rû-să-lēm, every one to his place, and place them in the house of God.

6 Now therefore, Tăt-nai, governor beyond the river, Shē-thăr-bōz-nai, and your companions the Ā-phăr-să-chītes, which are beyond the river, be ye far from thence:

7 Let the work of this house of God alone; let the governor of the Jēws and the elders of the Jēws build this house of God in his place.

8 Moreover I make a decree what ye shall do to the elders of these Jēws for the building of this house of God: that of the king's goods, *even* of the tribute beyond the river, forthwith expences be given unto these men, that they be not hindered.

9 And that which they have need of, both young bullocks, and rams, and lambs, for the burnt offerings of the God of heaven, wheat, salt, wine, and oil, according to the appointment of the priests which are at Jě-rû-să-lēm, let it be given them day by day without fail:

10 That they may offer sacrifices of sweet savours unto the God of heaven, and pray for the life of the king, and of his sons.

11 Also I have made a decree, that whosoever shall alter

this word, let timber be pulled down from his house, and being set up, let him be hanged thereon; and let his house be made a dunghill for this.

12 And the God that hath caused his name to dwell there destroy all kings and people, that shall put to their hand to alter *and* to destroy this house of God which is at Jě-rû-să-lēm. I Dă-rî-ūs have made a decree; let it be done with speed.

13 ¶ Then Tăt-nai, governor on this side the river, Shē-thār-bōz-nai, and their companions, according to that which Dă-rî-ūs the king had sent, so they did speedily.

14 And the elders of the Jēwś builded, and they prospered through the prophesying of Hăg-gai the prophet and Zēch-ă-rî-ăh the son of Id-dō. And they builded, and finished *it*, according to the commandment of the God of Īś-rā-ěl, and according to the commandment of Çy-rūs, and Dă-rî-ūs, and Ār-tă-xěrx-ēs king of Pěr-siā.

15 And this house was finished on the third day of the month Ā-dār, which was in the sixth year of the reign of Dă-rî-ūs the king.

16 ¶ And the children of Īś-rā-ěl, the priests, and the Lē-vites, and the rest of the children of the captivity, kept the dedication of this house of God with joy,

17 And offered at the dedication of this house of God an hundred bullocks, two hundred rams, four hundred lambs; and for a sin offering for all Īś-rā-ěl, twelve he goats, according to the number of the tribes of Īś-rā-ěl.

18 And they set the priests in their divisions, and the Lē-vites in their courses, for the service of God, which is at Jě-rû-să-lēm; as it is written in the book of Mō-sēs.

19 And the children of the captivity kept the passover upon the fourteenth day of the first month.

20 For the priests and the Lē-vites were purified together, all of them *were* pure, and killed the passover for all the children of the captivity, and for their brethren the priests, and for themselves.

21 And the children of Īś-rā-ěl, which were come again out of captivity, and all such as had separated themselves unto them from the filthiness of the heathen of the land, to seek the LORD God of Īś-rā-ěl, did eat,

22 And kept the feast of unleavened bread seven days with joy: for the LORD had made them joyful, and turned the heart of the king of Ās-syr-ī-ă unto them, to strengthen their hands in the work of the house of God, the God of Īś-rā-ěl.

CHAPTER 7

Now after these things, in the reign of Ār-tă-xěrx-ēs king of Pěr-siā, Ěz-rā the son of Sē-rai-ăh, the son of Āz-ă-rî-ăh, the son of Hīl-kî-ăh,

2 The son of Shăl-lūm, the son of Ză-dōk, the son of Ā-hî-tūb,

3 The son of Ām-ă-rî-ăh, the son of Āz-ă-rî-ăh, the son of Mē-rai-ōth,

4 The son of Zěr-ă-hî-ăh, the son of Ūz-zī, the son of Būk-kī,

5 The son of Ā-bī-shû-ă, the son of Phīn-ě-hăs, the son of

Ēl-ē-ă-zăr, the son of Āa-rōn the chief priest:

6 This Ěz-rā went up from Băb-ŷ-lōn; and he was a ready scribe in the law of Mō-sēs, which the LORD God of Īś-rā-ěl had given: and the king granted him all his request, according to the hand of the LORD his God upon him.

7 And there went up *some* of the children of Īś-rā-ěl, and of the priests, and the Lē-vites, and the singers, and the porters, and the Nēth-ŷ-nīmś, unto Jě-rû-să-lēm, in the seventh year of Ār-tă-xěrx-ēs the king.

8 And he came to Jě-rû-să-lēm in the fifth month, which was in the seventh year of the king.

9 For upon the first day of the first month began he to go up from Băb-ŷ-lōn, and on the first day of the fifth month came he to Jě-rû-să-lēm, according to the good hand of his God upon him.

10 For Ěz-rā had prepared his heart to seek the law of the LORD, and to do *it*, and to teach in Īś-rā-ěl statutes and judgments.

11 ¶ Now this is the copy of the letter that the king Ār-tă-xěrx-ēs gave unto Ěz-rā the priest, the scribe, *even* a scribe of the words of the commandments of the LORD, and of his statutes to Īś-rā-ěl.

12 Ār-tă-xěrx-ēs, king of kings, unto Ěz-rā the priest, a scribe of the law of the God of heaven, perfect *peace*, and at such a time.

13 I make a decree, that all they of the people of Īś-rā-ěl, and of his priests and Lē-vites, in my realm, which are minded of their own freewill to go up to Jě-rû-să-lēm, go with thee.

14 Forasmuch as thou art sent of the king, and of his seven counsellors, to inquire concerning Jūd-ăh and Jě-rû-să-lēm, according to the law of thy God which is in thine hand;

15 And to carry the silver and gold, which the king and his counsellors have freely offered unto the God of Īś-rā-ěl, whose habitation is in Jě-rû-să-lēm,

16 And all the silver and gold that thou canst find in all the province of Băb-ŷ-lōn, with the freewill offering of the people, and of the priests, offering willingly for the house of their God which is in Jě-rû-să-lēm:

17 That thou mayest buy speedily with this money bullocks, rams, lambs, with their meat offerings and their drink offerings, and offer them upon the altar of the house of your God which is in Jě-rû-să-lēm.

18 And whatsoever shall seem good to thee, and to thy brethren, to do with the rest of the silver and the gold, that do after the will of your God.

19 The vessels also that are given thee for the service of the house of thy God, *those* deliver thou before the God of Jě-rû-să-lēm.

20 And whatsoever more shall be needful for the house of thy God, which thou shalt have occasion to bestow, bestow it out of the king's treasure house.

21 And I, *even* I Ār-tă-xěrx-ēs the king, do make a decree to all the treasurers which *are* beyond the river, that whatsoever Ěz-rā the priest, the scribe of the law of the God of

heaven, shall require of you, it be done speedily,

22 Unto an hundred talents of silver, and to an hundred measures of wheat, and to an hundred bāths of wine, and to an hundred bāths of oil, and salt without prescribing *how much*.

23 Whatsoever is commanded by the God of heaven, let it be diligently done for the house of the God of heaven: for why should there be wrath against the realm of the king and his sons?

24 Also we certify you, that touching any of the priests and Lē-vītes, singers, porters, Nēth-ī-nīmś, or ministers of this house of God, it shall not be lawful to impose toll, tribute, or custom, upon them.

25 And thou, Ėz-Ŗă, after the wisdom of thy God, that is in thine hand, set magistrates and judges, which may judge all the people that *are* beyond the river, all such as know the laws of thy God; and teach ye them that know *them* not.

26 And whosoever will not do the law of thy God, and the law of the king, let judgment be executed speedily upon him, whether *it be* unto death, or to banishment, or to confiscation of goods, or to imprisonment.

27 ¶ Blessed *be* the LORD God of our fathers, which hath put *such a thing* as this in the king's heart, to beautify the house of the LORD which is in Jē-rû-să-lēm:

28 And hath extended mercy unto me before the king, and his counsellors, and before all the king's mighty princes. And I was strengthened as the hand of the LORD my God was upon me, and I gathered together out of Īś-ră-ēl chief men to go up with me.

CHAPTER 8

THESE *are* now the chief of their fathers, and *this* is the genealogy of them that went up with me from Bāb-ŷ-lon, in the reign of Ār-tă-xērx-ēs the king.

2 Of the sons of Phīn-ē-hăś; Gēr-shōm: of the sons of Īth-ă-măr; Dăn-jēl: of the sons of Dă-vīd; Hăt-tūsh.

3 Of the sons of Shēch-ă-nī-ăh, of the sons of Phâr-ōsh; Zēch-ă-rī-ăh: and with him were reckoned by genealogy of the males an hundred and fifty.

4 Of the sons of Pă-hăth-mō-ăb; Ēl-ī-hō-ē-năi the son of Zēr-ă-hī-ăh, and with him two hundred males.

5 Of the sons of Shēch-ă-nī-ăh; the son of Jă-hă-zī-ēl, and with him three hundred males.

6 Of the sons also of Ā-dīn; Ē-bēd the son of Jōn-ă-thăn, and with him fifty males.

7 And of the sons of Ē-lām; Jēsh-ăi-ăh the son of Āth-ă-lī-ăh, and with him seventy males.

8 And of the sons of Shēph-ă-tī-ăh; Zēb-ă-dī-ăh the son of Mī-chă-ēl, and with him fourscore males.

9 Of the sons of Jō-ăb; Ō-bă-dī-ăh the son of Jē-hī-ēl, and with him two hundred and eighteen males.

10 And of the sons of Shē-lō-mīth; the son of Jōs-ī-phī-ăh, and with him an hundred and threescore males.

11 And of the sons of Bē-bă-ī; Zēch-ă-rī-ăh the son of Bē-bă-ī, and with him twenty and eight males.

12 And of the sons of Āz-găd; Jō-hă-năn the son of

Hăk-kă-tăn, and with him an hundred and ten males.

13 And of the last sons of Ād-ō-nī-kăm, whose names *are* these, Ē-līph-ē-lēt, Jē-ī-ēl, and Shēm-ăi-ăh, and with them threescore males.

14 Of the sons also of Bīg-vă-ī; Ū-thăi, and Zăb-būd, and with them seventy males.

15 ¶ And I gathered them together to the river that runneth to Ā-hă-vă; and there abode we in tents three days: and I viewed the people, and the priests, and found there none of the sons of Lē-vī.

16 Then sent I for Ēl-ī-ē-zēr, for Ār-ī-ēl, for Shēm-ăi-ăh, and for Ēl-nă-thăn, and for Jâr-īb, and for Ēl-nă-thăn, and for Nă-thăn, and for Zēch-ă-rī-ăh, and for Mē-shūl-lăm, chief men; also for Jōi-ă-rīb, and for Ēl-nă-thăn, men of understanding.

17 And I sent them with commandment unto Īd-dō the chief at the place Căs-ī-phī-ă, and I told them what they should say unto Īd-dō, *and* to his brethren the Nēth-ī-nīmś, at the place Căs-ī-phī-ă, that they should bring unto us ministers for the house of our God.

18 And by the good hand of our God upon us they brought us a man of understanding, of the sons of Măh-lī, the son of Lē-vī, the son of Īś-ră-ēl; and Shēr-ē-bī-ăh, with his sons and his brethren, eighteen;

19 And Hăsh-ă-bī-ăh, and with him Jēsh-ăi-ăh of the sons of Mē-răr-ī, his brethren and their sons, twenty;

20 Also of the Nēth-ī-nīmś, whom Dă-vīd and the princes had appointed for the service of the Lē-vītes, two hundred and twenty Nēth-ī-nīmś: all of them were expressed by name.

21 ¶ Then I proclaimed a fast there, at the river of Ā-hă-vă, that we might afflict ourselves before our God, to seek of him a right way for us, and for our little ones, and for all our substance.

22 For I was ashamed to require of the king a band of soldiers and horsemen to help us against the enemy in the way: because we had spoken unto the king, saying, The hand of our God is upon all them for good that seek him; but his power and his wrath is against all them that forsake him.

23 So we fasted and besought our God for this: and he was intreated of us.

24 ¶ Then I separated twelve of the chief of the priests, Shēr-ē-bī-ăh, Hăsh-ă-bī-ăh, and ten of their brethren with them,

25 And weighed unto them the silver, and the gold, and the vessels, *even* the offering of the house of our God, which the king, and his counsellors, and his lords, and all Īś-ră-ēl *there* present, had offered:

26 I even weighed unto their hand six hundred and fifty talents of silver, and silver vessels an hundred talents, *and* of gold an hundred talents;

27 Also twenty basons of gold, of a thousand drams; and two vessels of fine copper, precious as gold.

28 And I said unto them, Ye *are* holy unto the LORD; the

vessels *are* holy also; and the silver and the gold *are* a free-will offering unto the LORD God of your fathers.

29 Watch ye, and keep *them*, until ye weigh *them* before the chief of the priests and the Lē-vītes, and chief of the fathers of Īś-rā-ēl, at Jē-rû-sā-lēm, in the chambers of the house of the LORD.

30 So took the priests and the Lē-vītes the weight of the silver, and the gold, and the vessels, to bring *them* to Jē-rû-sā-lēm unto the house of our God.

31 ¶ Then we departed from the river of Ā-hā-vā on the twelfth day of the first month, to go unto Jē-rû-sā-lēm: and the hand of our God was upon us, and he delivered us from the hand of the enemy, and of such as lay in wait by the way.

32 And we came to Jē-rû-sā-lēm, and abode there three days.

33 ¶ Now on the fourth day was the silver and the gold and the vessels weighed in the house of our God by the hand of Mēr-ē-mōth the son of Ū-rī-āh the priest; and with him was Ēl-ē-ā-zār the son of Phīn-ē-hās; and with them was Jō-zā-bād the son of Jēsh-ū-ā, and Nō-ā-dī-āh the son of Bīn-nū-ī, Lē-vītes;

34 By number *and* by weight of every one: and all the weight was written at that time.

35 Also the children of those that had been carried away, which were come out of the captivity, offered burnt offerings unto the God of Īś-rā-ēl, twelve bullocks for all Īś-rā-ēl, ninety and six rams, seventy and seven lambs, twelve he goats *for* a sin offering: all *this* was a burnt offering unto the LORD.

36 ¶ And they delivered the king's commissions unto the king's lieutenants, and to the governors on this side the river: and they furthered the people, and the house of God.

CHAPTER 9

NOW when these things were done, the princes came to me, saying, The people of Īś-rā-ēl, and the priests, and the Lē-vītes, have not separated themselves from the people of the lands, *doing* according to their abominations, *even* of the Cā-nā-ān-ītes, the Hīt-tītes, the Pē-rīz-zītes, the Jēb-ū-sītes, the Ām-mōn-ītes, the Mō-āb-ītes, the Ē-gŷp-tīāns, and the Ām-ō-rītes.

2 For they have taken of their daughters for themselves, and for their sons: so that the holy seed have mingled themselves with the people of *those* lands: yea, the hand of the princes and rulers hath been chief in this trespass.

3 And when I heard this thing, I rent my garment and my mantle, and plucked off the hair of my head and of my beard, and sat down astonished.

4 Then were assembled unto me every one that trembled at the words of the God of Īś-rā-ēl, because of the transgression of those that had been carried away; and I sat astonished until the evening sacrifice.

5 ¶ And at the evening sacrifice I arose up from my heaviness; and having rent my garment and my mantle, I fell upon my knees, and spread out my hands unto the

LORD my God,

6 And said, O my God, I am ashamed and blush to lift up my face to thee, my God: for our iniquities are increased over *our* head, and our trespass is grown up unto the heavens.

7 Since the days of our fathers *have* we *been* in a great trespass unto this day; and for our iniquities have we, our kings, *and* our priests, been delivered into the hand of the kings of the lands, to the sword, to captivity, and to a spoil, and to confusion of face, as *it* is this day.

8 And now for a little space grace hath been *shewed* from the LORD our God, to leave us a remnant to escape, and to give us a nail in his holy place, that our God may lighten our eyes, and give us a little reviving in our bondage.

9 For we *were* bondmen; yet our God hath not forsaken us in our bondage, but hath extended mercy unto us in the sight of the kings of Pēr-siā, to give us a reviving, to set up the house of our God, and to repair the desolations thereof, and to give us a wall in Jūd-āh and in Jē-rû-sā-lēm.

10 And now, O our God, what shall we say after this? for we have forsaken thy commandments,

11 Which thou hast commanded by thy servants the prophets, saying, The land, unto which ye go to possess it, is an unclean land with the filthiness of the people of the lands, with their abominations, which have filled it from one end to another with their uncleanness.

12 Now therefore give not your daughters unto their sons, neither take their daughters unto your sons, nor seek their peace or their wealth for ever: that ye may be strong, and eat the good of the land, and leave *it* for an inheritance to your children for ever.

13 And after all that is come upon us for our evil deeds, and for our great trespass, seeing that thou our God hast punished us less than our iniquities *deserve*, and hast given us *such* deliverance as this;

14 Should we again break thy commandments, and join in affinity with the people of these abominations? wouldest not thou be angry with us till thou hadst consumed *us*, so that *there should be* no remnant nor escaping?

15 O LORD God of Īś-rā-ēl, thou *art* righteous: for we remain yet escaped, as *it* is this day: behold, we *are* before thee in our trespasses: for we cannot stand before thee because of this.

CHAPTER 10

NOW when Ěz-rā had prayed, and when he had confessed, weeping and casting himself down before the house of God, there assembled unto him out of Īś-rā-ēl a very great congregation of men and women and children: for the people wept very sore.

2 And Shēch-ā-nī-āh the son of Jē-hī-ēl, *one* of the sons of Ē-lām, answered and said unto Ěz-rā, We have trespassed against our God, and have taken strange wives of the people of the land: yet now there is hope in Īś-rā-ēl concerning this thing.

3 Now therefore let us make a covenant with our God to put away all the wives, and such as are born of them, according

to the counsel of my lord, and of those that tremble at the commandment of our God; and let it be done according to the law.

4 Arise; for *this* matter *belongeth* unto thee: we also *will be* with thee: be of good courage, and do it.

5 Then arose Ěz-ră, and made the chief priests, the Lē-vites, and all Īs-ră-ěl, to swear that they should do according to this word. And they swear.

6 ¶ Then Ěz-ră rose up from before the house of God, and went into the chamber of Jō-hā-nān the son of Ē-lī-āsh-īb; and *when* he came thither, he did eat no bread, nor drink water: for he mourned because of the transgression of them that had been carried away.

7 And they made proclamation throughout Jûd-āh and Jē-rû-să-lēm unto all the children of the captivity, that they should gather themselves together unto Jē-rû-să-lēm;

8 And that whosoever would not come within three days, according to the counsel of the princes and the elders, all his substance should be forfeited, and himself separated from the congregation of those that had been carried away.

9 ¶ Then all the men of Jûd-āh and Bēn-jă-mīn gathered themselves together unto Jē-rû-să-lēm within three days. It was the ninth month, on the twentieth day of the month; and all the people sat in the street of the house of God, trembling because of *this* matter, and for the great rain.

10 And Ěz-ră the priest stood up, and said unto them, Ye have transgressed, and have taken strange wives, to increase the trespass of Īs-ră-ěl.

11 Now therefore make confession unto the LORD God of your fathers, and do his pleasure: and separate yourselves from the people of the land, and from the strange wives.

12 Then all the congregation answered and said with a loud voice, As thou hast said, so must we do.

13 But the people *are* many, and *it is* a time of much rain, and we are not able to stand without, neither *is this* a work of one day or two: for we are many that have transgressed in this thing.

14 Let now our rulers of all the congregation stand, and let all them which have taken strange wives in our cities come at appointed times, and with them the elders of every city, and the judges thereof, until the fierce wrath of our God for this matter be turned from us.

15 ¶ Only Jōn-ă-thăn the son of Ās-ă-hěl and Jā-hă-zī-āh the son of Tīk-văh were employed about this *matter*: and Mě-shûl-lăm and Shăb-bē-thai the Lē-vite helped them.

16 And the children of the captivity did so. And Ěz-ră the priest, *with* certain chief of the fathers, after the house of their fathers, and all of them by *their* names, were separated, and sat down in the first day of the tenth month to examine the matter.

17 And they made an end with all the men that had taken

strange wives by the first day of the first month.

18 ¶ And among the sons of the priests there were found that had taken strange wives: *namely*, of the sons of Jēsh-û-ă the son of Jō-ză-dăk, and his brethren; Mă-ă-sei-ăh, and Ēl-ī-ē-zēr, and Jâr-īb, and Gēd-ă-lī-ăh.

19 And they gave their hands that they would put away their wives; and *being* guilty, *they offered* a ram of the flock for their trespass.

20 And of the sons of Īm-mēr; Hă-nă-nī, and Zēb-ă-dī-ăh.

21 And of the sons of Hâr-īm; Mă-ă-sei-ăh, and Ē-lī-jăh, and Shēm-ai-ăh, and Jē-hī-ěl, and Ūz-zī-ăh.

22 And of the sons of Păsh-ur; Ēl-ī-ō-ē-nai, Mă-ă-sei-ăh, Īsh-mă-ěl, Nēth-ă-neel, Jō-ză-băd, and Ēl-ă-săh.

23 Also of the Lē-vites; Jō-ză-băd, and Shīm-ē-ī, and Kē-lai-ăh, (the same is Kē-lī-tă,) Pēth-ă-hī-ăh, Jûd-ăh, and Ēl-ī-ē-zēr.

24 Of the singers also; Ē-lī-āsh-īb: and of the porters; Shăl-lŭm, and Tē-lēm, and Ū-rī.

25 Moreover of Īs-ră-ěl: of the sons of Pâr-ōsh; Ră-mī-ăh, and Jē-zī-ăh, and Măl-chī-ăh, and Mī-ă-mīn, and Ēl-ē-ă-zăr, and Măl-chī-jăh, and Bē-nai-ăh.

26 And of the sons of Ē-lăm; Măt-tă-nī-ăh, Zēch-ă-rī-ăh, and Jē-hī-ěl, and Āb-dī, and Jēr-ē-mōth, and Ē-lī-ăh.

27 And of the sons of Zăt-tû; Ēl-ī-ō-ē-nai, Ē-lī-āsh-īb, Măt-tă-nī-ăh, and Jēr-ē-mōth, and Ză-băd, and Ā-zī-ză.

28 Of the sons also of Bē-bă-ī; Jē-hō-hă-nān, Hăn-ă-nī-ăh, Zăb-bă-ī, and Āth-lă-ī.

29 And of the sons of Bă-nī; Mě-shûl-lăm, Măl-lŭch, and Ā-dai-ăh, Jăsh-ŭb, and Shē-ăl, and Ră-mōth.

30 And of the sons of Pă-hăth-mō-ăb; Ād-nă, and Chē-lăl, Bē-nai-ăh, Mă-ă-sei-ăh, Măt-tă-nī-ăh, Bēz-ă-lēel, and Bīn-nŭ-ī, and Mă-năs-sēh.

31 And of the sons of Hâr-īm; Ēl-ī-ē-zēr, Īsh-ī-jăh, Măl-chī-ăh, Shēm-ai-ăh, Shīm-ē-on,

32 Bēn-jă-mīn, Măl-lŭch, and Shēm-ă-rī-ăh.

33 Of the sons of Hăsh-ŭm; Măt-tē-nai, Măt-tă-thăh, Ză-băd, Ē-līph-ē-lēt, Jēr-ē-mă-ī, Mă-năs-sēh, and Shīm-ē-ī.

34 Of the sons of Bă-nī; Mă-ă-dă-ī, Ām-răm, and Ū-ěl,

35 Bē-nai-ăh, Bē-dei-ăh, Chēl-lŭh,

36 Vă-nī-ăh, Měr-ē-mōth, Ē-lī-āsh-īb,

37 Măt-tă-nī-ăh, Măt-tē-nai, and Jă-ă-sau,

38 And Bă-nī, and Bīn-nŭ-ī, Shīm-ē-ī,

39 And Shēl-ē-mī-ăh, and Nă-thăn, and Ā-dai-ăh,

40 Măch-năd-ē-bai, Shă-shai, Shâr-ă-ī,

41 Āz-ă-reel, and Shēl-ē-mī-ăh, Shēm-ă-rī-ăh,

42 Shăl-lŭm, Ām-ă-rī-ăh, and Jō-sēph.

43 Of the sons of Nē-bō; Jē-ī-ěl, Măt-tī-thī-ăh, Ză-băd, Zē-bī-nă, Jă-dau, and Jō-ěl, Bē-nai-ăh.

44 All these had taken strange wives: and *some* of them had wives by whom they had children.
